We have gathered in this cemetery to remember our soldiers who were caught up in the courageous but tragic events of the First World War. We remember those who were killed in action, or by disease; and the bereaved, the lost, the families which were shattered, the wounded, maimed and injured, those who held in silence unspeakable memories of warfare. As we remember those who fought and those who remained anxiously at home, let us pray that God will speak a word of peace, and bring us his healing.

Today, we remember with thanksgiving these nineteen soldiers who, alongside so many others, answered the call of their country, served with honour and gave their lives in the service of their nation.
